



We need to be trained to be thankful. We find gratitude hard for many reasons, but, at least in my case, saying "thank you" or expressing appreciation is difficult because it strikes at my independence.

Americans, rightly, value our independence, but sometimes independence can be a negative thing. Sovereignty carries with it the danger of selfreliance, and to turn from God to the self is to turn from good, for only God is good.

To turn to God is to be thankful and to be thankful is to relish and express our dependence on Him for everything. We may glory in our achievements and appreciate others' accomplishments, but we may only do so properly when we are staring God in the face.

As the Psalmist writes:


"Let us give thanks to the Lord for He is good, and His mercy endures forever."




**MORGAN**

# How will God use you?


Volunteering at UGM-TC helps many in our community, and Eric is one volunteer who makes a big difference here every day, every year. And he says you can too!




